

CROSSROADS OF AMERICA

AIR Indianapolis International Airport is the 8th largest cargo facility and is home to the 2nd largest FedEx hub worldwide. FedEx has announced \$1.5B expansion investment to the Indy airport. For seven years, Indianapolis International Airport has been recognized as the best airport in North America by the Airports Council International. First year-round nonstop transatlantic flight to Paris started in 2018.

RAIL 1st in the U.S. for rail tons of primary metal products originated and 3rd in the U.S. for total freight railroads with 41.

ROAD National leader in pass-through interstates


WATER With 3 international ports and 400 miles of navigable waterways, Indiana is home to the only statewide port system providing international connections for America's Heartland via the Great Lakes and Ohio-Mississippi river system.

INFRASTRUCTURE INVESTMENT

20-year, fully funded road and bridge program (\$2.5B in next 5 years). \$1.2B annually in new funding by 2024 for transportation infrastructure.
